

NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF INHABITANTS

Total population.—The island of Guam was ceded by Spain to the United States December 10, 1898, but was not enumerated at a Federal decennial census until 1920. Previous enumerations had been made, however, under the direction of the governor. In conformity with the act of Congress providing for the Fifteenth Census, the census of Guam was taken under the supervision of the governor in accordance with plans prescribed or approved by the Director of the Census. The population on April 1, 1930, according to the Fifteenth Census, was 18,509, which represents

an increase of 5,234, or 39.4 per cent, as compared with the population on January 1, 1920. The total area of the island of Guam as shown in Table 2, is 206 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1930 was 89.8 as compared with 64.4 in 1920.

Table 1 shows the population of Guam taken at the Federal censuses of 1930 and 1920, and the population of 1910 and 1901 as reported by the naval governor, together with the increase between the censuses.

Minor civil divisions.—Table 3 shows the population of the eight municipalities of Guam by towns and barrois, where such divisions exist. The population of the naval reservations, including the personnel of the United States ships stationed in Guam, has not been distributed in this table to the various municipalities,

but is shown separately at the end of the table. Comparative figures for 1920 are given for barrios and towns where available. The municipalities, having been established since 1920, show no comparable figures for the previous census.

COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

Introduction.—This section presents the complete statistics for the population of Guam classified by sex, color or race, age, marital condition, etc. These detailed statistics are given in some form for all the areas shown in the preceding tables except for the barrios, towns, and villages. The first Federal census of Guam having been taken in 1920, there are no comparable figures available for prior years except for the total population.

In Table 1 is given the total population of Guam, of Agana, the principal city, and of the rural sections outside Agana city, for 1930 and 1920. In this table are also given separate figures for the United States naval reservations, including persons on United States ships stationed in Guam, as reported at the census of 1930. A greater portion of this naval population should no doubt be assigned to the city of Agana, but the exact location of these reservations could not be determined from the information given by the enumerators on the census schedules.

Color or race, nativity, and sex.—In Table 2 are presented the population statistics for Guam classified by color or race, nativity, and sex for 1930, and by color and sex for 1920. The divisions of the population by color or race are: Chamorro, white, Filipino, Japanese, Chinese, and Negro and other colored.

The Chamorros are the native inhabitants of Guam. The name Chamorro is derived from the Chamorri or Chamoli, the ancient word for "noble." The Chamorros are a hybrid race, being a mixture of Malayan, Spanish, Mexican, English, and other races, with the Malayan strain predominating.

Statistics of the population classified by color or race and sex are presented for municipalities, for naval reservations, and for the city of Agana in Table 9. The white population for 1930 (1,205) as given in Table 2 includes the white naval population (892) of Guam; whereas the white population for 1920 (280) is exclusive of the naval population.

Of the 18,300 persons of native birth reported at the census of 1930, 16,319, or 89.2 per cent are Chamorros, and all but 12 of these Chamorros were born in Guam. Of the native-born white population, 1,051 were born in continental United States, 79 in Guam, 4 in the Philippine Islands, 2 in Hawaii, 1 in Puerto Rico, 1 in the Virgin Islands, and 1 at sea. Of the native-born Filipino population, 277 were born in Guam and 87 in the Philippine Islands.

Of the 209 persons of foreign birth reported at the census of 1930, 83 were Chamorros, 79 of whom were born in the Pacific Islands other than United States possessions. Of the foreign-born white population, 45 were of European and 7 of Canadian birth. Of the foreign-born Japanese population, 55 were born in Japan.

Age.—By reason of the outstanding importance of the age classification of the population at the present time, the 1930 age statistics are presented in considerable detail in Table 3. In this table the age classification is presented not only for the total population but also for the principal race classifications (Chamorro, white, Filipino, Japanese, Chinese, and Negro and other colored), by sex. Similar statistics are presented in Table 8 for municipalities, for naval reservations, and for the city of Agana. Comparative figures for 1920 are given in Table 3 for the total population by sex for those groups for which available.

School attendance.—The children of Guam between the ages of 7 and 12, inclusive, are compelled by law to receive public instruction. The school-attendance tabulation for Guam is based on the replies to the enumerator's inquiry as to whether the person had attended school or college of any kind since September 1, 1929. The statistics for 1930 for the principal race classifications separated into significant age periods, and certain comparative figures for 1920, are presented in Table 4. School attendance is shown for municipalities, for naval reservations, and for the city of Agana in Table 9.

Illiteracy.—The census defines as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to read and The classification is based on the answers given to the enumerator in response to the question "Whether able to read and write." No specific test of ability to read and write was prescribed, but the enumerators were instructed not to return the answer "Yes" (which would classify the person as literate) simply because a person was able to write his or her name. Due to the present improved school conditions in Guam, illiteracy is confined almost entirely to persons 21 years of age and over. The comparison of illiteracy in Guam in 1930 with illiteracy in 1920 can not be made for the races by age groups for the reason that data concerning illiteracy by races were not given in 1920, nor were the age groups in 1920 the same as in 1930. The statistics of illiteracy are presented for the island as a whole in Table 5, and for municipalities, for naval reservations, and for the city of Agana in Table 9.

Ability to speak English.—In 1930 a total of 5,219 males and 3,694 females, or 69.1 per cent of the population 10 years of age and over, reported that they could speak English. Of this total, 4,000 males and 3,340 females were reported as Chamorros. In 1920 there were 2,542 males and 1,842 females, or 47.6 per cent of the total population 10 years of age and over, reported as able to speak English.

Marital condition.—The classification as to marital condition—whether single, married, widowed, or divorced—is presented for the population 15 years of age and over by sex and color in Table 6 for the island

as a whole, and in Table 9 for municipalities, for naval reservations, and for the city of Agana.

Gainful workers in specified occupations.—In Table 7 is shown the population 10 years of age and over engaged in gainful occupations. The figures are presented for the various races by sex.

Persons engaged in gainful occupations in Guam increased from 4,083 in 1920 to 6,178 in 1930, or 51.3 per cent. Approximately one-half of the number reported in 1930, exclusive of soldiers, sailors, and marines, were male Chamorros engaged in agricultural pursuits. Of the 961 women engaged in gainful occupations in 1930, 625 were Chamorros reported as cooks or as engaged in other domestic occupations.
